ANDREW JACKSON'S HERMITAGE ADDS TOURS IN NEXT PHASE OF REOPENING

WHAT: As Nashville moves into Phase 3, The Hermitage will activate its next phase of reopening. Beginning Thursday, June 25, ticket options will include the In Their Footsteps tour, the VIP tour of the mansion, and the Grounds Pass. The 1,120-acre National Historic Landmark will remain open to the public Thursday through Sunday, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., with the last ticket sold at 4 p.m.

The In Their Footsteps tour tells the stories of the enslaved men and women who lived and worked at The Hermitage during the life of Andrew Jackson and beyond his death.

The VIP tour includes a fully guided tour through The Hermitage mansion, with an opportunity to take in the view from the Hermitage balcony, as well as a tour of the grounds, Jackson's tomb, garden and the mansion and Andrew Jackson: *Born for a Storm* exhibit.

Social distancing measures, including caps on the number of guests per tour, will remain in place. Guests will be required to wear masks on all tours.

ADDITIONAL: The Hermitage officially reopened to the public on June 11 with a Grounds Pass, which allows visitors the opportunity to explore the property by foot. Guests are allowed to bring well-behaved dogs, picnics or games on-site.

Additionally, visitors can now take advantage of wine tastings, wine flights and wine by the glass or bottle as part of the new partnership with Natchez Hills Winery and Vineyard. Natchez Hills Winery at Andrew Jackson's Hermitage is located inside the Kitchen Cabinet Café onsite, and complimentary tastings are included with the purchase of tour tickets and Grounds Passes.

Grounds passes for adults are \$12, children ages 12-17 are \$6, and children younger than 12 are free. Tour ticket prices vary by type. Visitors are encouraged to purchase tickets online, but the ticket office will be open for on-site purchases. Social distancing protocols are in place as guests purchase tickets and encouraged throughout the property.
