



**ANDREW JACKSON FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES MICHAEL MILLER
AS SVP, INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT**

***Former PGA Regional CEO to Oversee Marketing,

NASHVILLE, TENN. (July 5, 2023) – The Andrew Jackson Foundation (AJF), whose endeavors include the operation of [Andrew Jackson's Hermitage](#), announced today that Michael Miller has joined the organization as senior vice president of institutional advancement. Miller will oversee marketing, sales, membership and fundraising initiatives for the foundation and the 1,120-acre National Historic Landmark, home of the seventh president of the United States.

Miller, who most recently served as chief executive officer for the Southwest Section of the Professional Golfers' Association of America (PGA), established a distinguished 37-year career with professional golf's governing. During his tenure with the PGA, Miller led the efforts to create both the Illinois Section and Southwest Section PGA Foundations, which served as the charitable arms of the organizations. His leadership brought financial growth and stability through the successful creation of endowments and major-gift campaigns.

"Moving from an institution like the PGA to an institution like the Andrew Jackson Foundation and the beloved homeplace of Jackson himself is an exciting opportunity," said Miller. "The Jacksonian legacy is momentous and historically urgent, and the opportunity to be a part of the mission behind the organization and a unique landmark like The Hermitage is very special."

Miller joins the AJF as the organization looks to the future and the evolving role of The Hermitage as a catalyst for change, education and dialog. An icon of American history, Jackson remains a polarizing figure. The Hermitage survives as a touchstone to that history, providing new perspectives on the man and his times. The foundation's mission is to preserve Jackson's historic homeplace, create valuable learning opportunities and inspire citizenship.

"We're very pleased to have someone of Michael's proven ability and track record joining us in such an important role," said Howard J. Kittell, president and CEO of the Andrew Jackson Foundation. "His passion for people and team building will strengthen our organizational efforts across the board, resulting in more fulfilling experiences for our visitors, donors and partners."

Located in Nashville and operated by the Andrew Jackson Foundation, The Hermitage first opened to the public in 1889. It is one of the oldest, largest and most popular presidential homesites and museums in the U.S.
