



On November 28, The Hermitage will Direct GivingTuesday Donations to the Future Presidents of America Youth Leadership Camp

Global generosity movement follows Thanksgiving holiday every year

NASHVILLE (November 21, 2023) – This GivingTuesday, November 28, The Hermitage, the Tennessee home of Andrew Jackson, will inspire generosity by directing all contributions to the organization's Future Presidents of America Youth Leadership Camp, an annual student education and development program. The goal of The Hermitage on GivingTuesday is to raise at least \$10,000.

All donations to The Hermitage on Giving Tuesday will benefit the endowment fund of the non-profit Andrew Jackson Foundation, which owns and operates the 1,120-acre National Historic Site located just outside downtown Nashville. These funds will allow new scholarships to be available for deserving students 12 to 16 years old to attend the FPA camp, held in June each year.

"GivingTuesday is an ideal time for anyone interested in supporting the educational and student programs at The Hermitage to make any donation that they can," said Howard J. Kittell, president and CEO of the Andrew Jackson Foundation. "Those contributions will help further our mission at The Hermitage to inspire and excite young people about civic leadership."
